

Can I use fiber optic internet without a router

How Fiber Internet Works

You lose network management features such as firewalls, parental controls, and device prioritization.

Alternatives and Integrated Devices

Some ISPs provide all-in-one ONT/router units, which combine the ONT and router functions. These devices simplify setup and allow multiple wired and wireless devices to connect without needing separate equipment. If your goal is to avoid a traditional router but still support multiple devices, an integrated ONT/router is the most practical solution.
