Power On the Router: Wait for the router's indicator lights to confirm a successful connection. You may need to configure the router via its admin panel to finalize the setup.

Alternative: Fiber-Ready Routers

Some routers have SFP or fiber WAN ports that allow direct fiber connections without a separate ONT. These routers are designed to handle optical signals internally, but you must verify compatibility with your ISP and the type of fiber connector (e.g., SC/APC or SC/UPC) before attempting a direct connection.
