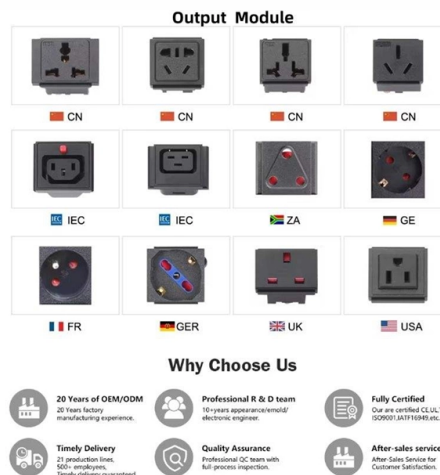

Securing cables: Light cables should be fastened with tie wraps or straps to prevent movement, especially in vertical tray runs . Environmental factors: For outdoor or corrosive environments, consider FRP or corrosion-resistant trays to protect cables . Grounding: Metallic trays must be grounded according to NEC Article 250.96, even if not used as an equipment grounding conductor .
