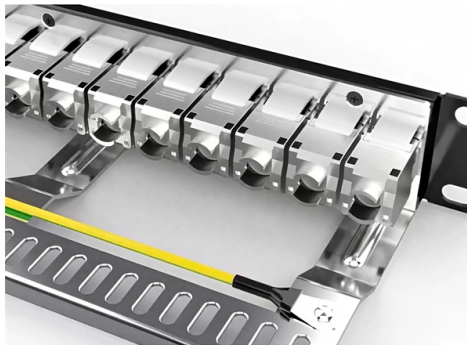


Can optical cables and electrical cables be stored in the same rack

Best Practices for Co-Locating Cables

Maintain proper bend radii (usually 100–130 mm for fiber) and leave enough slack for easy maintenance and reconfiguration.

Airflow and Thermal Considerations: Ensure that cables do not block air intake or exhaust of network devices. Overcrowding or improper bundling can reduce cooling efficiency, especially in racks with high-power PoE++ switches or dense fiber deployments.

Labeling and Documentation: Clearly label both optical and electrical cables to simplify troubleshooting and maintenance. Use consistent color coding and labeling conventions to distinguish cable types and endpoints.

Rack Layout Recommendations: Follow a “sandwich” layout where patch panels, cable managers, and switches are arranged to optimize airflow and accessibility. Reserve extra U-space and depth to accommodate future growth and thicker cables.
