

Can routers be used with different fiber optic cables

Routers cannot directly connect to fiber optic cables; an Optical Network Terminal (ONT) is required to convert optical signals into electrical signals compatible with your router.

- Power Sequence:** Power on the ONT first, wait for it to establish a connection with the ISP, then power on the router. This ensures proper signal initialization.
- Router Configuration:** Access the router's interface (usually via 192.168.0.1 or 192.168.1.1) to configure network settings, enable Quality of Service (QoS) if needed, and verify connectivity.

Considerations for Different Fiber Types

- Single-Mode Fiber:** Ideal for long-distance connections; typically uses SC/APC connectors.
- Multi-Mode Fiber:** Suitable for shorter distances with higher data rates; often uses LC or ST connectors.

Ensure the router or ONT supports the specific fiber type and connector to avoid compatibility issues.
