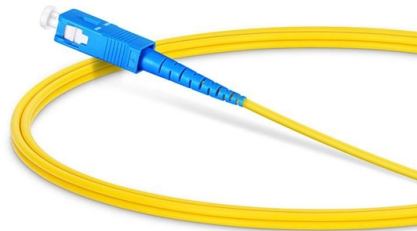

Numbering Conventions Circuit numbers are often assigned according to standards or internal guidelines. For instance, some systems designate a prime number for the panelboard, which then serves as the base for numbering all circuits connected to that panel. In North American panels, breakers are usually numbered left-to-right along each row, with each row fed from a different phase to balance the load.

Practical Example In a home, a distribution box may have 12 circuits. Each circuit number corresponds to a specific function: lighting, sockets, kitchen appliances, or HVAC systems. If a technician needs to work on the kitchen sockets, they can identify the correct breaker by its circuit number, switch it off, and safely perform maintenance without disrupting other areas.
