The hot aisle /cold aisle data center layout was originated by IBM in 1992 and it is one of the oldest ways to save energy in the data center. 1 Hot aisle/cold aisle layout involves lining up server racks in alternating rows with cold air intakes – the fronts of servers – facing each. Hot aisle and cold aisle containment are foundational concepts in data center design. When implemented correctly, they improve efficiency, reduce energy consumption, extend equipment life, and enhance overall reliability. To maintain thermal performance, equipment accessibility, and safety, it's essential to follow key spatial guidelines. Maximum Aisle Length: When equipment cabinets form a continuous row.
