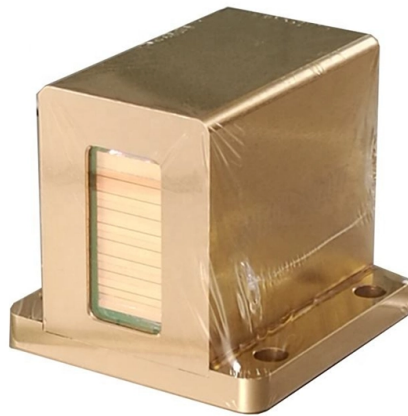

Designer shall provide a 12" vertical working clearance above the cable tray with no continuous obstructions. In addition, a 12" space must be provided on either side for working access.
