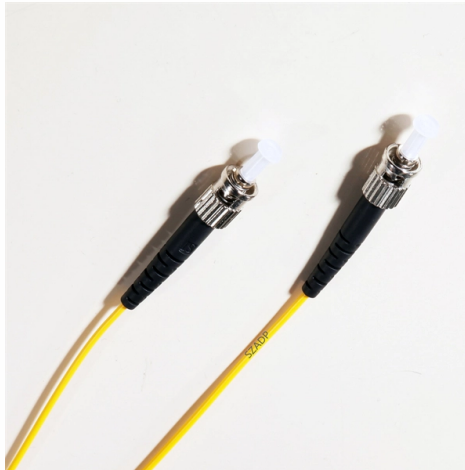

They are the most common choice for modern fiber optic installations where signal integrity is important.
