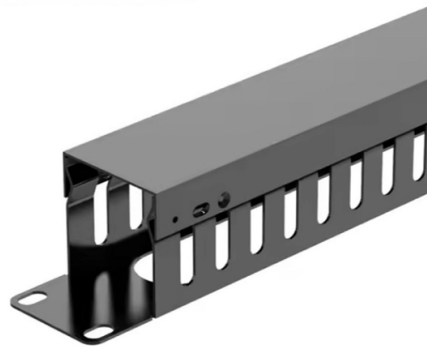


Disassembly and Assembly Methods of Distribution Boxes

- Inspect and Clean** Check for corrosion, loose connections, or damaged insulation. Clean the enclosure and components as needed ().

Assembly Steps

- Prepare the Enclosure** Ensure the box is clean, dry, and free of debris. Verify that the enclosure meets the required IP/NEMA rating for the installation environment ().
- Install Internal Components** Mount busbars, terminal blocks, and circuit breakers according to the design layout. Ensure proper spacing and secure fastening ().
- Connect Wiring** Route wires neatly through channels or ducts. Connect each wire to its corresponding terminal, following the labeling from disassembly. Ensure correct wire gauge and breaker size ().
- Sequential Connector Mating** For Powersafe or similar systems, connect the Earth first, then Neutral, followed by phase connectors (L1, L2...
