

Do low-voltage wiring rooms need cable trays



Overview

Careful planning of cable routing into and within LV switchgear rooms improves safety and maintainability. Use cable trenches, underfloor ducts, or overhead cable trays to bring feeders and outgoing circuits into the room. A poor choice can lead to signal interference, difficult. Like medium-voltage switchgear, low-voltage switchgear is also less often installed with individual panel design on site, but delivered as factory-assembled, type-tested switchgear. For design verification, testing is to be accomplished successfully in compliance with IEC 61439-1 and IEC 61439-2. DIN rail mounts, if your devices support the standardized mounting system. Voltage classifications can be confusing. Cable tray is the preferred wiring method for industrial facilities, data centers, and large commercial buildings where routing dozens or hundreds of cables through individual conduits would be impractical and expensive.
