An aggregate switch is a high-capacity network switch that consolidates connections from multiple access switches, acting as a central point for managing network traffic and providing enhanced bandwidth capabilities. It is essential for larger networks requiring efficient data flow. The Pro Aggregation does this with its SFP28 25Gbps ports. The regular Aggregation switch is best used to connect all devices in a rack. Switch aggregation, also known as link aggregation or trunking, is a method used in computer networking to combine (aggregate) multiple network connections in parallel. This article looks at what each such tool does, compares how they differ from each other, and offers suggestions as to what sort of network each. All UniFi Switches support aggregation, except USW-Flex, USW-Flex-Mini and USW-Ultra. Port aggregation is not supported on most UniFi Gateways; it is only supported on the EFG, UXG Enterprise, UDM Pro, UDM SE and UDM Pro Max.
