Stacking allows network expansions, redundancy scenarios, and single IP management to be. A link aggregation group (LAG) is the combined collection of physical ports. Other umbrella terms used to describe the concept include trunking, bundling, bonding, channeling or teaming. Implementation may follow vendor-independent standards such as Link Aggregation Control Protocol. An Aggregation or "Top-of-Rack" switch is designed to connect everything in a rack at high speeds, then have an even bigger pipe out to the rest of the network. The Pro Aggregation does this with it's SFP28 25Gbps ports. They are designed specifically for routing. What devices support port aggregation?

All UniFi Switches support aggregation, except USW-Flex, USW-Flex-Mini and USW-Ultra.
