Individual circuit breakers: Protect specific circuits from overload. Bus bars and wiring: Distribute electricity safely to each circuit. If the box is mounted on a cabinet near the entrance, it may be a sub-panel or a main panel integrated into the wall for convenience. Ensure the door can open fully to 90 degrees and that the area in front remains unobstructed. Safety and Compliance While existing panels are not required to meet current NEC codes, inspectors may flag panels in non-ideal locations for safety reasons.
