Maintain bend radius limits to prevent signal loss; avoid sharp turns and excessive twisting. Vertical cabling should be supported with cable ties or clamps at regular intervals to prevent sagging and mechanical stress. Separation from power cables is essential to reduce interference and maintain safety. For raised floors or drop ceilings, route cables along accessible spaces and secure them neatly to prevent accidental damage.

Termination and Connection **Splicing:** Use fusion splicing or mechanical splicing to join fiber sections with minimal signal loss. **Termination:** Connect fibers to patch panels or network equipment using proper connectors, ensuring clean and precise alignment. **Slack management:** Leave adequate service loops in trays or racks to facilitate future maintenance without stressing the fibers. **Testing and Verification** Use an Optical Time-Domain Reflectometer (OTDR) to detect faults, bends, or splice imperfections.
