Fiber Optic Drop Cable A fiber optic drop cable is the link between the distribution box and the end user, delivering high-speed connectivity directly to homes or businesses. Key characteristics include:

- Structure:** Single-core, double-core, or four-core; can be flat figure-8 with central reinforcement (metallic or non-metallic).
- Fiber type:** G.657 bend-insensitive fibers allow tight bending (as small as 20mm radius) for indoor or building entry.
- Sheath:** Low-smoke-zero-halogen (LSZH) or flame-retardant PVC for safety and environmental compliance.
- Deployment:** Suitable for aerial, indoor, or short-distance outdoor installations; may include metallic strength members for support and rodent-resistant layers for underground use.
- Applications:** 1F for households, 2-4F for enterprise users, adaptable to various field connectors and splicing methods.
