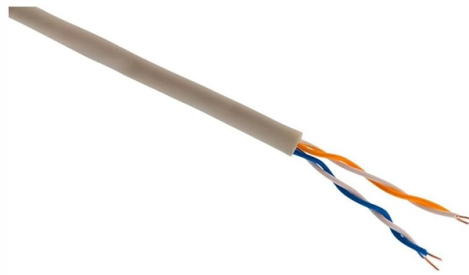

This method provides low insertion loss, high reliability, and long-term stability. Fusion splicing is typically performed inside the terminal box using dedicated splice trays that protect the spliced fibers. 2. Mechanical Splicing Mechanical splicing uses a precision alignment device to hold fiber ends together, often with a gel or adhesive to reduce signal loss. This method is faster than fusion splicing and is useful for temporary connections or field repairs, t...
