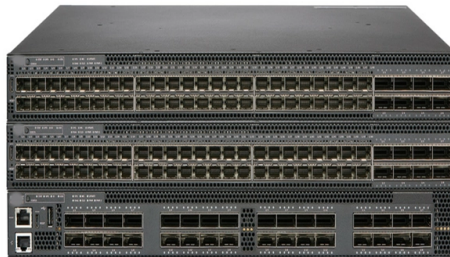


Fiber optic cable installation and junction box
