Slack storage areas inside the box may also be labeled to indicate fiber type and length, aiding in maintenance and troubleshooting. Additional Considerations Boxes are designed to withstand environmental conditions, including UV exposure, moisture, and temperature extremes, ensuring the number and labeling remain visible over time. Security features such as locks or bolts may be present, but the identification number is still accessible for authorized personnel.
