

Gigabit switch that can connect to fiber optic cable

A Gigabit switch can connect to a fiber optic cable using SFP or GBIC transceivers, with the choice of single-mode or multi-mode fiber depending on distance and network requirements.

Key Components

SFP/GBIC Modules: Most modern Gigabit switches include SFP (Small Form-factor Pluggable) or GBIC (Gigabit Interface Converter) slots that allow fiber connectivity. Installation Guidelines

Select the Correct SFP/GBIC Module: Ensure the module matches the fiber type and desired bandwidth. For 1G connections, standard SFP modules are used; for 10G, SFP+ modules are required.

Connect Fiber Strands Properly: Duplex fiber requires reversing connections between switches (send on port A connects to receive on port B and vice versa) to ensure proper signal transmission.

Distance Considerations: Multi-mode fiber supports shorter runs (up to ~550 meters for 1000BaseSX), while single-mode fiber can extend several kilometers, with premium single-mode fiber reaching up to 100 km in long-haul applications.

Network Topology: Star and daisy chain topologies are commonly used. Star topology connects all devices to a central switch, providing high performance and reducing collisions, while daisy chain links switches sequentially.

Extended Range: Fiber allows connections far beyond the 100-meter limit of copper Ethernet cables.
