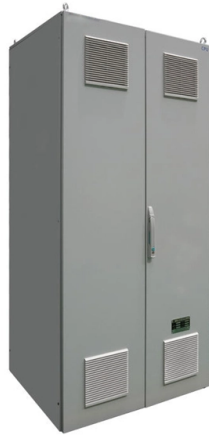


How far apart should multi-layer cable trays be

Vertical Spacing For multi-layer or stacked cable trays, the minimum vertical clearance between the upper and lower trays should be 150 millimeters (6 inches). This clearance provides sufficient access for maintenance, inspection, and prevents cables from touching, which could lead to short circuits or electromagnetic interference (EMI). For power and signal cable trays, a minimum horizontal separation of 0.5 meters is recommended to reduce EMI, though this can be reduced to 0.3 meters if the trays are shielded.

Support Spacing The support span for cable trays, which is the distance between supporting brackets or hangers, typically ranges from 1.5 to 3 meters for standard horizontal runs. Heavy-duty or long-span trays may allow supports up to 6 meters, depending on the manufacturer's specifications and the total cable load. Proper support spacing prevents sagging, maintains tray stability, and reduces mechanical stress on cables.

Additional Considerations Ensure adequate clearance above trays (at least 12 inches) for installation and maintenance access. Maintain proper spacing from thermal or corrosive pipelines: at least 500 mm if insulated, 1000 mm if uninsulated. Use cable ties or fasteners to secure cables in vertical or angled runs to prevent shifting and i...
