General Requirements for Cabinets and Racks

The minimum spacing for bend radius for fiber-optic cables should have the front mounting posts of the cabinet offset from the front door by a minimum of 3 in. (7.6 cm).

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There should be a minimum of 2.5 inches (6.4 cm) clear space between the side edge of the chassis and the side wall of the cabinet. No sizeable flow obstructions should be immediately in the way of
