Tray Type Considerations: Open cable trays are preferred for main runs, while conduits are used for drops, wall penetrations, or fire-rated barriers. Tray depth and width should accommodate cable fill without exceeding 50% of the tray cross-section for power cables, with 20–25% spare capacity for future expansion.
