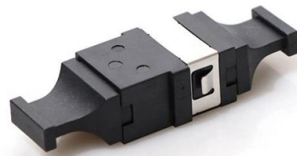


How should the switches in the distribution box be arranged

Protective Devices Include RCCBs (Residual Current Circuit Breakers) to protect against leakage currents, electrical shocks, and insulation failures. RCCBs are usually installed after the main switch but before the branch MCBs to ensure all circuits are protected.

Wiring and Cable Management Incoming wires from the main supply connect to the main switch first. Wiring between the main switch and branch breakers should be neat, preferably routed on the left side, while outgoing wires to loads exit on the right.

Use appropriate wire sizes: 2.5mm² for lighting and sockets, 4mm² for high-power appliances.

Bind wires with plastic ties at uniform spacing to keep them straight and organized.

Color coding: phase wires (yellow, green, red for A, B, C phases) and neutral wires (blue) should follow standards.

Labeling and Safety Clearly label each circuit for easy identification. Mark the voltage type (AC/DC) and any special circuits. Perform a safety inspection after...
