

How to Configure and Manage the Core Switch

Configuring a core switch involves setting up VLANs, routing, interfaces, management IPs, security, and redundancy to ensure high-speed, reliable network backbone performance.

Basic Setup

- Hostname and Management IP:** Assign a professional hostname and configure a management IP on the core switch to allow remote administration and monitoring.
- Console and Access Security:** Set passwords for console, Telnet, or SSH access, and configure role-based access control to secure the switch.
- Firmware and System Checks:** Verify the switch hardware, check for damaged cables, and update firmware to the latest stable version.

VLAN and Interface Configuration

- Create VLANs:** Define VLANs for different network segments, including interconnection VLANs for BRASs, firewalls, and aggregation switches.
- Assign Interfaces:** Bind physical interfaces to VLANs and configure VLANIF interfaces for Layer 3 routing.
- VPN Instances:** Use VPN instances to isolate public network routes from internal or firewall return routes.

Routing and Protocols

- Layer 3 Routing:** Configure static routes or dynamic routing protocols like OSPF to enable connectivity between internal networks and egress points.

Backplane Bandwidth Consideration: Ensure the switch's backplane can handle the expected inter-port traffic to avoid bottlenecks.

Advanced Features

- Spanning Tree Protocol (STP):** Enable STP to prevent loops in the network and maintain redundancy.
- Quality of Service (QoS):** Configure QoS policies to prioritize critical traffic and optimize performance.
- Port Security and ACLs:** Restrict unauthorized access and control traffic flow using access control lists.

Redundancy and High Availability: Implement redundant links and switch stacking or VRRP/HSRP for failover.

Monitoring and Maintenance

- NetFlow or SNMP:** Enable traffic monitoring and logging to track performance and detect anomalies.
