

How to calculate the loss of an unequal-score optical transducer



Overview

Optical attenuation compares input and output power on a logarithmic scale. When powers are in linear units, the loss in decibels is: $\text{Attenuation (dB)} = 10 \times \log_{10} (\text{Pin} / \text{Pout})$. If the link length L is provided, the attenuation coefficient is: $\text{Coefficient (dB/km)} = \frac{\text{Attenuation (dB)}}{L}$. When light propagates in a transparent medium, some of its optical power may be lost due to different physical effects: Some of the light may be absorbed. The corresponding energy will often be converted into heat, but it may also lead to fluorescence at other optical wavelengths. These all can contribute to total system loss and affect the survivability and longevity of the employed optical components.
