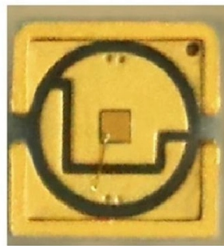


How to connect a home fiber optic cable to a switch

Secure and Manage Cables: Avoid tight bends; maintain the minimum bend radius to prevent signal loss or breakage. Use cable management tools like velcro straps.

Test the Connection: Use an OTDR or optical power meter to verify signal strength and detect any faults.
