Slower but Permanent Options Fusion Splicing Fusion splicing melts fiber ends together using an electric arc, producing the lowest attenuation (0.01–0.03 dB) and a nearly permanent connection. While highly reliable for long-distance or critical links, it requires specialized equipment and professional operation, making it slower than fast connectors or mechanical splicing.

Active Connections Plug-and-play connectors (LC, SC, ST) are convenient for reconfigurable networks but may introduce 10–20% light loss. They are simple to use but not as fast as pre-polished fast connectors for large-scale installations.
