

How to connect the fiber optic cable when changing routers

You connect a fiber optic cable to a new router by linking it through the Optical Network Terminal (ONT) using an Ethernet cable from the ONT's LAN port to the router's WAN port.

Align the connector using the key or tab and push it in until it clicks securely.

Step 3: Connect the ONT to the Router Use a high-quality Ethernet cable (Cat6a or higher recommended) to connect the ONT's LAN/Ethernet port to the WAN/Internet port on your new router. Ensure the router's WAN port is compatible and labeled clearly, often in a different color.

Step 4: Power Up Devices Power on the ONT first and wait for it to establish a connection with your ISP. Status lights should indicate power and a stable optical link. Once the ONT is stable, power on the router. Check the router's indicator lights to confirm a successful connection.

Step 5: Configure the Router Access the router's admin panel via a browser using its IP address (commonly 192.168.1.1). Configure settings such as WAN connection type or DHCP, if required by your ISP. Ensure the router firmware is up to date to maintain compatibility and performance.
