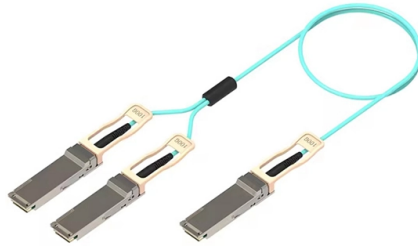


How to cut the tail fiber
