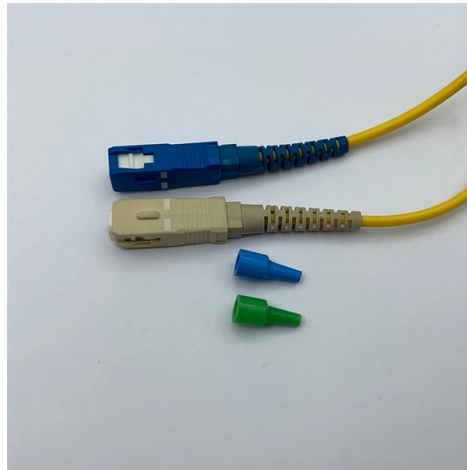

- Aerial Installation:** Cables are mounted on poles or buildings. Proper sag (e.g., 2.5 feet for a 150-foot span) accommodates thermal expansion and contraction.
- Underwater or Special Environments:** Gel-filled or moisture-blocking cables are used for water crossings, with specialized laying equipment for undersea applications.

Handling and Safety: Maintain proper bend radius (10–15 times the fiber diameter for fiber optic cables) and pull tension limits to prevent damage. Use cable lubricants, pulling grips, and avoid using the cable as a rope. Wear safety gear and follow environmental protection protocols.

Splicing, Termination, and Testing: Fusion splicing is standard for field connections. Factory-made pigtails are spliced to the cable ends, and all connections should be inspected with a microscope. Test each fiber with an OTDR a...
