

How to reserve cables on a network patch panel

Bundle and secure cables: Use Velcro straps or zip ties to bundle cables neatly, avoiding over-tightening to prevent damage. Maintain a small loop or slack to allow future adjustments or replacements.

Separate power and data cables: Route data cables away from power lines to minimize electromagnetic interference (EMI) and maintain signal integrity.
