Plan the Route Before routing, map the cable path from the tray exit to the termination point, avoiding obstacles such as structural beams, HVAC ducts, or other utilities. Include slack of 10–15% to accommodate future adjustments or equipment relocation. Ensure that termination points are accessible for maintenance and inspection. Transition to Equipment When connecting to devices, panels, or junction boxes, use proper entry fittings such as bushings or grommets to protect the cable insulation from abrasion....
