

How to splice black steel wire optical cables

Step 4: Final Protection Slide a protective outer sleeve or heat-shrink tubing over the entire splice area to maintain both mechanical strength and environmental protection. Inspect the splice visually and, if possible, test the optical signal to confirm low attenuation and proper alignment.
