Termination and Wiring: Connect line to line, neutral to neutral, and ground to ground following color coding standards. Secure wires to terminals using screws or wire strippers, and route wires neatly with cable ties, leaving space for heat dissipation.

Labeling: Clearly mark each circuit for easy identification and future maintenance.

Testing and Safety Checks Before powering on, perform the following tests:

Insulation Resistance Test: Verify insulation between wires and the box meets required standards.

Circuit On/Off Test: Use a multimeter to ensure all circuits function correctly and there are no short circuits.
