Cable Pulling and Tension Control: Pulling fiber optic cables is a high-risk stage. Use a tension controller to monitor pulling force and never exceed the cable's rated tensile strength. Pulling speed should generally be kept below 15 meters per minute. Mechanical pulling should include swivel connectors and guiding pulleys to prevent torque and bending at corners.

Splicing and Termination: Splicing should be performed in controlled environments such as splice closures, with humidity below 70%. Clean fibers with alcohol wipes and lint-free paper, and protec...
