- 4. Consider Fire-Resistant Enclosures** For higher protection or floor-standing distribution boards, use fireproof enclosures with certified ratings (e.g., F30/F90, I30/I90, E30/E90) that maintain functionality during a fire. These enclosures often include:
 - Automatic closure of ventilation openings during fire.
 - Fire-resistant doors and mantles.
 - Surface or flush mounting options.
