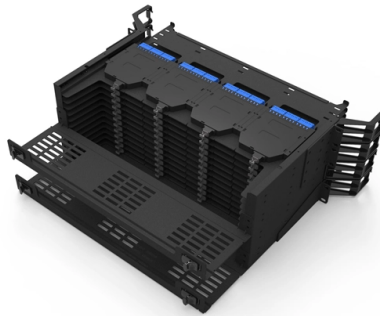


Is it safe to use white fiber optic cables outdoors
