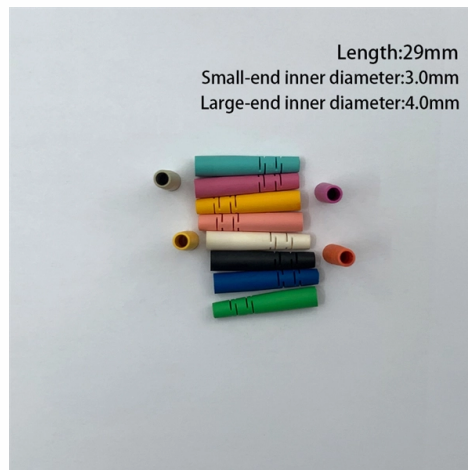

Receiving End: At the monitoring station, connect the fiber to another media converter or fiber-enabled PoE switch, which converts the optical signal back to Ethernet for the NVR or display.
