- Cable Management:** Maintain proper cable separation by voltage level, avoid over-bending, and secure cables with ties or clamps to prevent movement and friction.
- Fire Safety:** Use fire-rated materials, install fire barriers where cables penetrate walls or floors, and seal trays when passing through fireproof or explosion-proof areas.
