Terminal or Connector Position: Numeric identifiers on terminal blocks or bus bars indicate the exact connection point. For PGND and BGND connections, only the row and column of the distribution box are required, not individual terminal numbers.

Safety Warnings: Labels may include arc flash warnings, high-voltage symbols, or instructions for PPE compliance, following OSHA and ANSI standards.

Label Placement and Orientation: Labels are affixed to one side of identification plates on cable ties or directly on the distribution box. Text orientation should be consistent across all labels in the same cabinet, facing up for easy readability. For AC power cables, labels are placed on the insulating sheath and include only essential information like voltage and cabinet number.
