For example, a final-level RCD may have a sensitivity of 30 mA for end-user protection, while a distribution-level RCD may have higher ratings for larger loads. Function and Type: Indicate the type of RCD (AC, A, or B type) and its function, such as "Leakage Protection" or "Residual Current Device," to avoid confusion with other breakers. Durable and Legible Labels: Labels should be permanent, legible, and resistant to environmental factors like moisture or heat, following general marking standards for electrical equipment. Graphical Symbols: Use standard electrical symbols for RCDs and leakage protection where applicable, as recommended in IEC 60204-1 and other safety standards. Hierarchical Coordination In a tiered RCD protection system, final-level RCDs in the end-user circuits are more sensitive, while distribution-level RCDs handle higher currents.
