- Isolators:** Manually operated switches for safe maintenance, constructed from durable insulating materials and metals.
- Neutral and Grounding Links:** Metal bars or strips, usually copper or tinned copper, providing safe return paths and grounding.
- Terminal Blocks:** Often made from thermoplastic bases with metal contacts, used for custom wiring and connections.
- Gaskets and Seals:** Rubber or silicone gaskets ensure waterproofing and IP-rated protection (IP65/IP66) for outdoor or humid environments.
- Insulation Linings:** For metal boxes, additional insulation is applied to the interior surfaces to prevent electrical arcing and heat buildup.
