The number of ports directly influences the number of optical modules needed. Pigtails Pigtails are short fiber cables with a connector on one end and bare fiber on the other, used to connect optical modules or splice into fiber distribution systems. The number of pigtails corresponds to the number of ports or fibers that need to be terminated. For example, a 96-port FDHT may require up to 96 pigtails if each port is terminated individually. In HPC networks, pigtails are used to connect NICs to switches or patch panels, and the quantity depends on the network topology and the number of optical modules deployed.
