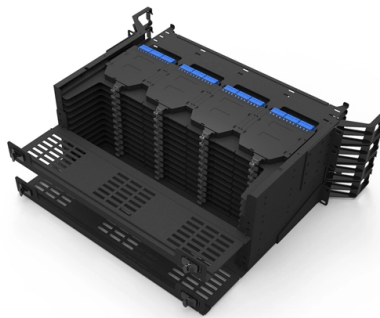

RCDs and protection devices should be positioned for quick access and clear visibility. Circuit breakers should be sized according to load type (resistive, inductive, capacitive) and installed with proper spacing to prevent overheating.

Safety and Compliance Follow NEC, IEC, or local electrical codes for installation, grounding, and protection. Ensure proper insulation, wire gauge, and breaker ratings to prevent overloads and short circuits. Install boxes in dry, ventilated, and accessible locations, typically around 1.5 meters above the floor for...
