Practical Considerations While higher IP ratings offer stronger protection, they can also trap moisture inside if the cabinet is tightly sealed, leading to condensation and potential equipment damage. Therefore, it is important to balance protection with ventilation and moisture control. Environmental factors such as humidity, temperature fluctuations, coastal salt air, and industrial pollution should influence the choice of IP rating. For example, coastal areas may benefit from NEMA 4X-rated enclosures to resist corrosion, while standard outdoor cabinets in moderate climates may perform well with IP55 or IP65.
