Install or reconnect circuit breakers, RCDs, and surge protection devices as required. Ensure all connections are tight and secure to prevent overheating or short circuits.

Testing and Compliance After raising and wiring the box, perform a full inspection and testing according to local standards (e.g., DIN VDE 0100 in Germany or NEC in the U.S.). This includes insulation resistance tests, loop impedance measurements, and functional tests of protective devices. Only after passing these tests should the box be energized.

Additional Tips Consider modular or sub-distribution boards if space is limited or if additional circuits are needed. Label all circuits clearly for future maintenance. If unsure about handling high-voltage wiring, hire a licensed electrician.
