- Install the New Wire:** Strip the insulation at the ends, connect one end to the grounding bar in the distribution box, and the other end to the grounding rod or metal part of the box. Tighten all connections securely to prevent looseness.
- Test Ground Resistance:** After installation, use a voltmeter or ground resistance tester to ensure the resistance meets safety standards. For distribution boxes, the resistance between system parts should typically be below 0.1 Ohm. If the resistance is too high, additional grounding rods or improved connections may be necessary.
- Safety Considerations:** Always turn off the main power before working on the ground...
