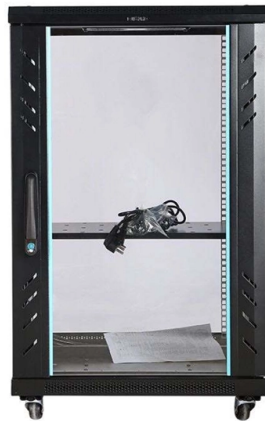


## Secondary distribution box cannot be connected
