Typical Design

A secondary distribution box with double switches usually includes:

- Enclosed high-voltage equipment for primary input.
- Three-phase transformers to step down voltage.
- Low-voltage switchgear with two independent switches or bus sections.
- Bus tie breaker to connect or isolate the two switches.
- Protective devices such as fuses or breakers for overload and short-circuit protection ().

The design can be manual, semi-automatic, or fully automatic, depending on the application and reliability requirements.
